The Leadership Golden ornament fundraiser was born in 1986, with an idea from Bill Robie, one of the early leaders of LG.

Each year, the Board of Directors works with a local artist to decide a scene to be featured. The original artwork is donated to the Golden Civic Foundation for their annual auction, in thanks for the Foundation's early support of LG.

The ornaments are offered for sale at various locations in the downtown Golden area. Current class members also participate in ornament sales.

The "Collector Series," now a total of 36 ornaments, has become extremely popular. Many citizens are the proud owners of a complete set!




